Keys to Effective Leadership

Everyone wants to become a "leader" but being a "leader" is more than a notion. In order for our scholar-athletes to become leaders we must first give them some keys to becoming leaders. Here are a few that will help mold our scholar-athletes into great leaders.

Honest. Always do the honest thing. It makes teammates feel like they know where they stand with you at all times.

Caring. The strongest, most effective leaders I've met care not just about the team, but about the people in it and the people impacted by it. Plus, they show they care through their words and actions.

Confident. If you don't believe in yourself, no one will. I hear leaders worrying that if they show too much confidence, others will think them arrogant. The reality is people want to know what you know for sure -- and what you don't. Having the confidence to admit that you don't know something but willing to get the answer is an admirable trait.

Collaborative. True leaders solicit input and feedback from those around them so that everyone feels part of the process.

Persuasion abilities. Players have to believe in you and your credibility. Your brand matters and you have to model it. Once you model your brand, then you have to persuade people of this -- it doesn't just happen.

Leverage team strengths. Your job as a leader is to understand each player's strengths and place them in positions where they can flourish and grow. If you are good at that, you have a huge part of the equation for success.

Cheerleader. Players are practicing very long hours and they need to take some time to celebrate their successes in order to recharge their batteries.
