Middle School Baseball & Softball Championship




The Barret's Chapel Softball team was coached by Amber Adler. Charleigh Beth Cole was named MVP. Barret's Chapel went on to represent Memphis in the West TN Sectionals versus Three Oaks Middle School. The Wildcats ended their season as West TN TMSAA Sectional Runner-Ups.



The White Station Spartan softball team won their 4th SCIAA Championship in a row lead by MVP Reagan Fiore. Coach Amy Thornton has led the team to 7 championships as the head coach. The Spartans fell to Brighton in the West TN Sectional game.



The JP Freeman Panthers were led by their MVP pitcher, Galvin Sims in the championship game in May. Coached by Colin Rork, the Panthers finished their season with a tough loss to Three Oaks Middle School in the West TN Sectional Championship



The White Station Spartans, coached by Coley Thornton continued their dominance in the large division to seal their 4th SCIAA Championship in as many years. Ben Roan was selected as the MVP. The Baseball Spartans went on to defeat Munford 6-3 to be named the West Tennessee Sectional Champions. Their second TMSAA title in as many years.

The Whitehaven High School Tiger Softball team coached by Jason Harris is back to back District regular season champs and District Tournament Runner-Ups. They are fairly young team with the exception of 4 senior ladies who are a joy to work with and will be missed. Cordesia Williams was voted MVP by the team.


